Consultation Meeting re joining a Multi Academy Trust

As you know I am retiring at the end of this academic year and governors and I want to ensure that the school is in the best possible position to ensure that all pupils and staff continue to flourish in our wonderful school. Our pupils are our priority and we firmly believe that looking to join the trust will be an exciting opportunity that will benefit the school, pupils and staff whilst still keeping our own uniqueness and identity.

Please try to come along to the consultation meeting next Tuesday 6th February at 4.45 pm where there will be lots of opportunities to ask questions and to meet Paul Rickeard from the Durham and Newcastle Diocesan Learning Trust (DNDLT). Your opinions really matter and it will be an opportunity to learn about what the trust can offer us as a school and what we can bring to the trust too. This is a consultation process and your opinions and views really do matter.

Governors have met with Headteachers/Chairs who are already in this trust and their feedback has been incredibly positive in terms of the support they have had from the trust, the positive impact for staff and pupils but also that the schools who have joined retain what makes them unique and special.

What have we been Learning?

Class Swale are really enjoying learning all about castles in their new topic. They have been very enthusiastic about finding out when the first castles were built and why they were built.

The early years children have been building their own castles using cardboard bricks which were kindly donated to school. The whole class have also been getting to know Miss Cherrie, a student teacher on placement from York St John University. Miss Cherrie will be on placement at our school until the Easter holidays and she is already enjoying her time in our school, planning exciting activities for Class Swale pupils and working with the Class Swale team

Class Wear go swimming every Monday and last week they all tried very hard and had a brilliant time. They were encouraged to go under water to try and find the sinker toys and practiced floating on the water.

They have also started to learn how to play the glockenspiel in music. They practised playing notes D and E and did really well when playing as whole class.





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In history they discovered the mystery of the empty Anglo-Saxon grave and the children used clues found in the grave to work out who had gone missing. The children are really engrossed in this topic and are enjoying learning lots of fun facts.

Class Tees pupils have been busy writing scripts for adverts and they are going to be filming them this week. In PE they have been working with Miss Turnbull, the PE teacher from, Staindrop Academy, who has been teaching netball in preparation for a tournament on the 14th February. She is very pleased with the skills that pupils are developing.

On Thursday Mr Preston, from Durham Music Service, is teaching African Drumming to all of the Year5/6 pupils. Mrs Maude and Mrs Kidd were extremely impressed at how the pupils are performing increasingly complex pieces and the children are thoroughly enjoying the sessions.

Our friends from church, the Open the Book Team, will be delivering an Open the Book session this week. They work together to retell a story from The Bible and children are always keen to volunteer, to act, sing and take part with all of the actions. This week the story is The Good Samaritan.

Measles – NHS Advice

I am sure that you have heard about the increase in cases of measles in some parts of the UK.Measles outbreaks happen when not enough children have been vaccinated. Measles can be a very serious disease, leading to ear and chest infections, fits, diarrhoea, and damage to the brain. Measles can also kill. Your child is at risk of measles if he or she hasn't had the measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccination. Two doses of MMR vaccine are needed to get the best protection.

If your child is due to have had 2 doses of MMR but has not yet received them, no matter what age they are, you should contact your GP to get them vaccinated as soon as possible. If you can't remember if your child has had any, 1 or 2 doses of MMR vaccine, check his or her personal child health record (the Red Book). If this doesn't help, speak to your local surgery.

Leave of absence / holidays cannot be authorised during term time unless in exceptional circumstances and we are encouraging all families to try to ensure that their child's attendance is in line with the national expectation of at least 96% or above. Having good attendance gives your child the best opportunity to reach their potential in all areas of the curriculum. When having to sit statutory assessments/tests good attendance allows your child to be best prepared to sit these tests and to face assessments with greater confidence.

The Local Authority can now issue fixed penalty notices if a child has unauthorised absences, including for repeated lateness. In school we will continue to celebrate good attendance and award excellent attendance.

We do understand that on occasions your child may be ill and need to stay at home but if they are just feeling slightly unwell or have a mild cold for example we do encourage you to send them into school. If your child feels unwell first thing on the morning but then is fine by lunchtime do send them to school for the afternoon session.

We have staff trained to administer medicine who can provide Calpol/Paracetamol during the morning/afternoon for minor ailments. Please contact school for an Authority to Administer Non-Prescription Medicine or complete the form via Operoo. It would be helpful if you could send in some paracetamol, however we do have a very small supply for emergencies.

Start of School Day

Please note the school day starts at 8.55am. Thank you for getting your child/children to school on time. Helping your child to arrive at school on time ensures they can then line up with their friends before the start of the school day leading to a smooth start for the day ahead.
