Attendance and Unauthorised Absence.

Thank you to all parents who support their child's punctuality and attendance at school. We do understand that children can be ill but by ensuring your child is in school as much as possible offers them a greater chance of success with their school work and personal development.

Please note if your child has 7 days unauthorised absence in term time in a 12-week period then the Local Authority can issue a fixed penalty notice to each parent/parents or carers per child. This can be made up from a combination of arriving late, unexplained absences and unauthorised holidays. From September 2024, this will change to 5 days and the fixed penalty's charge will increase significantly.

If your child is ill and unable to attend school please notify school by the start of the school day wherever possible and a call should be made **every day** of their absence. Messages can also be left on our answer machine or an email sent in to school even over the weekend.

Furthermore, if your child has a doctors, hospital or dental appointment, please inform the school office and provide evidence of upcoming appointments when requested.
