REMINDER COLD WEATHER PREPARATION

As the weather is getting colder, please can we ask that parents ensure children wear and/or bring a:

- school jumper or cardigan
- warm, waterproof coat
- wellies or suitable footwear
- hat



PE DAYS

WATERBOTTLES

Please send your child to school each day with a water bottle containing water only. These can be refilled across the day. Water is also provided on the lunch tables for all pupils (school meals and packed lunches).



LEAVE OF ABSENCE REQUESTS

Just a reminder that the law states that a Head Teacher is unable to grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are **exceptional circumstances**.

We ask that parents complete a leave of absence form which is available on our school website or from the school office.

Please be aware that unauthorised absences on your child's attendance records could result in you receiving a penalty notice from the local authority.

5 days / 10 sessions unauthorised absence in a 10 week rolling period must now be referred for enforcement action.

Within a 3-year period:

The first penalty notice is £160 if paid within 28 days, reduced to £80 if paid within 21 days.

A second penalty notice is £160 to be paid within 28 days.

A third penalty notice cannot be issued. Legal action may result (for example, prosecution).

Fines are issued per parent / per child, not per family.

The closing date for Secondary School applications is the **31st October 2025.** If parents do not wish to apply online they can complete a paper application form, and these are available on request from the School Admissions Team. A letter from Durham County Council has been sent home previously.






The Day the Crayons Made Friends by Drew Daywalt (author), Oliver Jeffers (illustrator)




The Wild Robot on the Island by Peter Brown (author)
