#### Joining a Multi Academy Trust

This week we have received an Academy Order that states in principle we can join the Durham and Newcastle Diocesan Learning Trust (DNDLT). I will keep parents, carers and pupils updated with any up-coming developments particularly in terms of leadership and I thank you once again for contributions made in the consultation period.

I know there are some changes ahead but this is also an exciting opportunity for our school to join a strong trust that understands our unique strengths and our strong partnership links with our community.

#### **Open the Book**

We must send a huge thank you to our friends from church who delivered an Open the Book session this week based on The Last Supper. With singing, costumes, sound effects and a super retelling of the story the children would certainly have a better understanding of the story delivered in such a fun way. The team are so fabulous that they then 'went on tour' to Ingleton to deliver the session there. I think they missed out at the Oscars they would certainly have had my vote!

#### **Science Week**

This week is national science week and as part of this the whole school had extra lessons and activities with a focus on STEM activities (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) This was also linked with careers. There was a real buzz around school with children being excited about science and excited to talk about their investigations.

#### Class Tees

This week they have learnt about properties of materials. As part of raising awareness about STEM careers Dr Broderick, a school governor, also spoke to the children about his career journey and the varied roles he had been involved in. The children developed their coding skills in Computing sessions and learnt about different scientists too.

#### Class Wear

Pupils planned and carried out investigations involving the setting of jelly finding it set quicker with fruit in it.- In computing they coded a time travel game and really enjoyed this. Investigations with flowers and dye have also got the children excited about the subject of science and wider STEM activities.

Thea 'The coding activity was good fun. I liked making predictions too. I would like another science week!'

Class Swale have been doing lots of timed trial investigations. The children came up with lots of their own ideas for investigations involving time. They have covered lots of areas of maths including measuring with trundle wheels and timing in seconds and minutes as well as collecting data. #### **School Meals**



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We have a wonderful cook in school and I have enjoyed very tasty school lunches this week and the summer menu looks very good. However, this week we have received notification from the Local Authority about price increases.

Please find attached a letter from the Durham School Meals Board informing all parents and carers about the increase to the cost of school meals from April 1<sup>st</sup> 2024. The cost will be £2.81 from April 1<sup>st</sup> and for our preschool children it will be £3.37. We certainly did not anticipate this rise in costs for our parents and carers. *Please note that this is not in any way a school-based decision*.

Children in receipt of Free School Meals and those children in the infants -Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 will continue to receive a free lunch. As a school we only receive £2.53 for Free School Meals and the Universal Infant Free School Meals and we have now been asked to budget for the shortfall which is 28p per day, per child certainly for the rest of this academic year. Hopefully the government will fund schools appropriately from September onwards.

If you have a child in school from Reception to Year 6 and your circumstances have changed please get in touch with Mrs Linsley if you think your child may qualify for Free School Meals as we can help to check this for you.

#### **Easter Competition.**

We are holding our ever-popular egg decorating competition. Your child just needs to take a boiled egg (they can use more than one if they like) and let their imagination run wild. In the past we have seen some amazing ideas and designs. There will be prizes for each class and we will also have an adult section- if parents/carers are feeling creative! All entries need to be brought into school on Thursday 28<sup>th</sup> March, our last day of term.
